SB 2418 also allows wineries to sell their products in open containers on the salesroom premises. Finally, the bill would allow the holder of a limited brewery or winery license producing 250,000 gallons or less per year to jointly operate a salesroom om the same premises. The retailer would be required to hire delivery employees and train them to recognize that customers are 21 years of age or older.
